TANK PAINTING IOI

ere's no brainer question for you all: what's there to do on a rainy January Saturday afternoon with no lawn to mow and no holiday to celebrate? Go learn how to paint tanks with **Bob Bethea**, of course!

Our tank painting course blasted off on January 28 at the new hobby store "The Hobby Shop" at Leander. We had five students (Marty Hebda, Kevin Hutchison, Rick Herrington, Ted Paone, and Craig Bland), one observer (Vince Hutson), and one teaching assistant (yours truly). After a short introduction, we dived in and got our hands dirty. In our first class, we learned from Bob how to use modulation (sometimes refer to as "Zenithal Light") technique to apply Olive Drab on a $1/35^{th}$ scale Sherman tank. The idea is to accentuate highlights and shadows on scale models so they look like the real thing when viewed in regular 1:1 light.

Bob has performed a demo at one of our shows and written an article (you can download it from our club's

At this month's meeting, we will be asking for volunteers to write monthly articles for the newsletter and give monthly program demonstrations. We will also have a brief discussion on how the Sherman painting class is coming along.

The program for this month will be two-fold. First, we will have a photographic wrap-up of 2023 *Winterblitz* from College Station. Then we will have

some WWII slides that have been only seen by a very small number of people.

Just a quick autobiography about me, Chris Chany. I was born and raised in Manhattan, NYC on the upper East Side and have lived in Texas for almost ten years now. Growing up, my dad (a WWII Veteran) and I built a few models together but no armor. In sixth grade, I was given a Monogram $1/48^{th}$ scale Grumman Wildcat which started me on my "kit building" journey. After running out of airspace by having over 125 airplanes hanging from the ceiling over my bunk bed, I started building Tamiya armor.

The first Tamiya kit I remember building was the BMW motorcycle with sidecar and two marching Germans. The *Kubelwagen* quickly followed. I have built most of the original Tamiya 1/35th scale German and American WWII armor, and the 1/25th scale Tiger and *Jagdpanther*. Growing up in NYC, you would never know where you would run into model kits for sale. There was a newsstand/cigar/ stationary store up the block where we would pick up the Sunday paper. It had a small selection of Airfix kits, and I got a Ju.52 from there. Down the block the other way was another newsstand where I got my Tamiya SdKfz.251. Later on, it became more

conventional, and most of my models were purchased at Jan's Hobby Shop on York Avenue and 77th Street and still later at Gateway Hobbies in the Garment District.





Our tank painting course will continue next weekend (Feb 4 Saturday) on decaling and filtering with artist oils. Then we conclude on the weekend after next (Feb 12 Sunday) with pin-washing and highlighting techniques.


