


DIY Acrylic Thinner & Airbrush Cleaner

The reason why I decided to make my own thinner/cleaner was that I couldn't find anything on the market that I really liked. Some thinners are very effective, but they are specific to certain brands of acrylic paints. I prefer one that can do a good job across the spectrum. Plus it's not that hard to "DIY" it, and you can save a bundle of money with these homebrews!

Here are the formulars for:



Glycerin is chemically inactive, so it doesn't add or subtract to the thinning or cleaning process. It's simply a lubricant to protect the rubber parts of your airbrush.

On the cleaner, avoid the type of Windex with ammonia. **Use the vinegar based one instead**. Ammonia is bad for the rubber gaskets and O-rings in your airbrush.

technique you are interested in learning, please let us know also so that we can possibly get it scheduled as a program at an upcoming meeting.




We will also have a brief discussion on the assessment of the Sherman painting class.




