V ou can't always get the subject you want in 1/72nd scale produced by a top-notch model company, but you can usually find it produced by another lesser label.

Knowing that I like that scale, a friend gave me an aftermarket stowage set for the WWII US halftrack. I felt the obligation to use it, so I bought the Academy M3A1 kit. Although it was a little less detailed than I've been used to with Flyhawk (or even Dragon), it does build up into a very respectable simulation of the real thing. Some parts



were thinned but otherwise it was built straight from the box.

Period photos from WWII show halftracks were utilized as a true "battle taxi" loaded with whatever the Gls could carry. I wanted my version to simulate that look. The aftermarket

pieces only went part of the way to the over-stowed look, so I added various items and weapons from my stash and Value Gear (valuegeardetails.com).

No vehicle looks good without a base, so I built one by sculpting in the bricks and adding a casting of a crushed 50-gallon fuel drum. It needed figures, so I used several from the Spanish figure company Scale75. They are magnificent and in scale. Scale75 also offers these computer-designed figures in $1/48^{\text{th}}$ and $1/35^{\text{th}}$. All have great details and animation.





The figures were done with Vallejo acrylic paints, and the halftrack was in Tamiya Olive Drab and highlighted heavily with Olive Drab combined with Dark Yellow for fading and scale color. Weathering was done with artist oil paints and pastel chalks.

This was my attempt to make the most out of an uninspiring kit, and I hope you like it.






New on The Block


Everyone is releasing older kits in Ukraine markings these days! RFM 1/35th 2in1 M1A1 is one of them.
