#### Product Review: E.T. Model 1/35<sup>th</sup> Soviet AFV Smoke Dischargers

s most of you have gathered, I mostly model Soviet/Russian vehicles. Modern Soviet vehicle kits typically come with "rounded" things with awful seams that need to be removed, sanded, filed, primed, and inspected. I specifically hate seams on gun barrels and smoke dischargers. Whenever I purchase aftermarket products (e.g. gun barrel), I usually add some smoke dischargers along with my order to make my build more enjoyable.

Recently I have exhausted my stockpile of 1/35<sup>th</sup> brass smoke dischargers. When I hopped on Hobbyeasy website (www.hobbyeasy.com) to replenish my supplies, I noticed the brass ones were no longer available. Fortunately, I did find an alternative:

Model's Soviet AFV Smoke
Dischargers
(ER35-007).



The packaging of this product leaves much to be desired: it has a skimpy description with




no instructions or photos. The price is cheap though (about USD \$4.59), so I took the gamble and ordered four sets.

Upon arrival, I inspected my order. Inside each set are two 3-D printed trays with eight empty dischargers on each tray. Eight will cover a typical Soviet vehicle. So for less than \$5, you can equip two models. Each set also comes with sixteen smoke cartridges in two distinct styles if you so choose to use them with the dischargers.

Overall, I am pleased with my purchase with one comment: the 3-D replacements are a tad smaller than the kit parts you are replacing with. Ultimately, I am pleased as I did not have to sand any seams.

are: 96"L x 27"D x 29.5"H. It has the following
amenities:

- Large white pegboard (32" x 48")
- Light fixture is 48" long with daylight bulbs
- Shelf under tabletop (96" long, 9" deep)
- TV mount with hardware and DVD shelf
- Two paint racks: the big one holds "standard" acrylic paints and the small one holds Tamiya paints (large and small)
- Two electrical power strips: 6 outlets on one, 4 on the other
- Extra: bunch of cool and model friendly things on the bench



The bench is currently at Kevin's old address in Smithville, TX. It is absolutely FREE, but no delivery is available (i.e. you have to make your own arrangement to haul it home!)

# New On The Block




Gecko Models has just released a 1/35<sup>th</sup> Vietnam War-era Saigon motor-tricycle with driver and passengers.
