## DESPERATION

his diorama is based on a hypothetical situation that could have occurred in a besieged German city if WWII had continued into 1946. While Henry painted the figures, Bob built the vehicle, groundwork and the ruins.

By this point of the war, most of the fighting would have taken place entirely in Germany. The figures in the diorama depict the known uniforms from the late stages of the war. The Wehrmacht at this point had suffered extreme losses in manpower. With the Allies encroaching deep into Germany and eventually reaching Berlin, Hitler

gave orders to muster all available men, which included the old and the young, to defend the Fatherland.

These men were assigned to any existing Wehrmacht units left in the field. They were given very little training and were issued inferior weaponry.

The figures used in the diorama are from the defunct figure company New World Miniatures. Bob altered some of the figures to fit the diorama with some receiving Hornet heads. Henry painted them all in acrylic paint mediums. The figures in the armored vehicle were painted in *Luftwaffe* colors, Field Blue

red and reed green pants.
However, some were painted in Italian camo scheme. The other figures represent volunteers from Volksstrum (citizen militia) and Hitlerjugend (Hitler Youth). These individuals were issued any uniforms that were in stock. Most of them usually wore their civilian clothing complemented with

army gear.

**Annual Kit Auction** 



The Hitler Youth figure is wearing a tunic painted in the final camouflage scheme, *Leibermuster*, with field grey trousers and the appropriate armband of the Hitler Youth.



The Leibermuster camouflage would have replaced all German camouflages for all of the German armed forces if the war had been prolonged. The Volksstrum soldier is wearing the wool overcoat in field grey with the appropriate armband of the Volksstrum.

The Borgward IV PzJg Wanze is a recent kit issued by Das Werk. Only a handful of photos of the Wanze exist, including one that was destroyed in front

of the *Reichstag* in Berlin. It is such a cool vehicle we had to use it in this diorama. Basically, it is the Borgward IV remote demolition vehicle with a multi-barrel *Panzerschreck* anti-tank rocket launcher on top. What a potential for disaster, but it is something a desperate army could presumably put together.

The kit went together and was a lot of fun except for the minute track links which were like building a  $1/72^{nd}$  armor kit. Bob used extra rockets and boxes from Miniart's *Panzerschreck* set and wired the lights







and rocket launcher with fly tying wire from Cabela's. He also applied a fictional camouflage scheme with Tamiya colors based on the traditional German Dark Yellow, Brown and green.

The base is an old trophy plaque relieved of its metal plate and replaced by sections of wall from old Verlinden buildings. The groundwork is sanded tile grout, pieces of broken plaster buildings, broken sheetrock, and plastic accessories from Miniart and other kits. All were airbrushed in Tamiya colors and detail painted in Vallejo acrylic paint.


